Our services

Herefordshire General Practice is committed to getting you home on time. We offer innovative solutions to improve your working day and the opportunity to work flexibly across services to suit your needs and interests.

Our core purpose is to ensure you find the right role for you so that you enjoy working in Herefordshire and can see your career developing with us. We will help to facilitate all of the roles below, whether it be working at a Herefordshire practice, in our at scale services or a combination to suit.

Practice based GP role (General)

- We can facilitate you to work directly for one of Herefordshire's GP practices, including partnership opportunities if this is of interest to you.

Monday to Friday 8am to 6.30pm

Enhanced Access service

- Operates on evening and weekends in multiple hubs across Herefordshire.
- Provides Primary Care Networks with appointments with healthcare assistants, practice nurses, GPs and advanced nurse practitioners.
- Provides care for patients who may not be able to access their GP practice during usual operating hours.

Evenings 6pm to 9pm Weekends 9am to 5pm

Herefordshire Remote Health (HRH)

- A remote working service.
- Supporting resilience in GP practices.
- Patients can be seen in the service if they feel their problem can be dealt with remotely.
- Supportive admin team and supervisory GP.



Reflect practice opening times

Out of Hours service

- Provides urgent medical advice and treatment to Herefordshire residents and visitors to the county.
- Operates across all hours when usual GP practices are closed.
- Triage and face-to-face appointments at the OOH base and home visits for patients contacting NHS111.
- Supports A&E by providing appointments for patients who after triage in A&E have been identified as having problems that could be managed in primary care.



Monday to Friday 6.30pm to 8am Saturdays, Sundays and Bank Holidays available 24 hours

Practice based GP role (Much Birch Surgery)

- Working with a dedicated team of healthcare professionals.
- A rural dispensing practice serving over 5,100 patients. Its latest CQC rating was 'Good'.
- Outy and routine sessions and opportunities for home working, subject to current clinical requirements.

Supervisory GP roles

- (v) In or out of hours, remote working from home.
- Supporting the Community Integrated Response Hub with managing patients in the community.
- Assessing and prescribing for patients via the Covid Medicine Delivery Unit.
- Supporting ANPs, paramedics and physician associates working across services.
- Providing peer support and case based reflection for members of the multi-disciplinary team.
- Formulating management plans for patients who may be based in care homes or community hospitals.

Herefordshire is a very rural, beautiful green county bordering south Wales. We have a population of around 200,000, around a third of whom live in Hereford City. Ninety-five per cent of the land is classified as 'rural' with over half of the population based in rural areas.

When you're not working, the environment is perfect for spending time with family and friends. You'll find wide open, uncrowded green spaces and beautifully clean country air.
